- Payment is NOT by the Government


- One System





Health consumption expenditures per capita, U.S. dollars, PPP adjusted, 2017

Cost Life Expectancy

- United States = \$10,224 (18% GDP) > 81.0
- Switzerland = \$8,009 (12% GDP) ➤ 83.3
- France = \$4,902 (12% GDP) > 82.9
- United Kingdom = \$4,246 (10% GDP) ➤ 81.2


